While autism is typically thought of as a childhood disorder, for many autistic individuals, symptoms persist throughout life. Recently, several papers have reported that autism is associated with an increased likelihood of presenile dementia, senile dementia and Parkinson's disease.

An important first step to getting a clearer understanding will be examining the brains of autistics for the telltale signs of dementia or

Parkinson's disease to determine if they are similar or different from nonautistic individuals.
